Honor Flight is a heartwarming documentary about four living World War II veterans and a Midwest community coming together to give them the trip of a lifetime. Volunteers race against the clock to fly

thousands of WWII veterans to Washington, DC to see the memorial constructed for them in 2004, nearly 60 years after their epic struggle.

The trips are called "Honor Flights" and for the veterans, who are in their late 80s and early 90s, it's often the first time they've been thanked and the last trip of their lives. The 24-hour journey is full of surprises that deeply move all who are involved. It's uncommon for World War II veterans to talk about the War, but the Honor Flight experience brings their stories out. Many veterans say, with the exception of their wedding day and the birth of their children, the trip is the best day of their life.

However, success is all but ensured. 1,000 World War II veterans die every day and getting them on an Honor Flight in time is a constant battle.

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

The tournament was separated into two periods with the anglers able to bring in a total of five keeper bass in the combined two halves. Their catch included the day's Big Bass, a 5 lb. 4 oz. trophy! the pair managed to add two more keeper bass in the second half, which raised their total catch to 11 lb. 14 oz. enabling them to take the top prize. 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
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


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


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Warm Caramel Apple Pudding Cake

- 1 large granny smith apple, peeled and thinly sliced
- 1 pkg. yellow cake mix, divided
- 2 pkg. (3.4 oz each) vanilla instant pudding
- 1 1/2 cups cold milk
- 1 jar (12.25 oz) caramel ice cream topping
- 1/4 cup water
- 1 cup thawed whipped topping
- 1/2 cup dry roasted peanuts

Directions:

- 1. Heat oven to 350°F. Toss apples with 1 Tbsp. cake mix. Prepare cake batter with remaining cake mix as directed on package; pour into 13x9-inch baking dish sprayed with cooking spray. Top with apples.
- 2. Beat dry pudding mixes, milk, 3/4 cup caramel topping and water with whisk 2 min.; drizzle over apples. Place baking dish on baking sheet.
- 3. Bake cake 1 hour to 1 hour 10 min. or until golden brown. Cool 20 min. (Sauce will thicken slightly as it cools.)
- 4. Whisk remaining caramel topping and whipped topping until well blended. Spoon over cake slices just before serving; top with nuts.

LAKE SANTEE PUMPS MORE FIRE PROTECTION INTO THE TOWNSHIP

It's been nearly twenty years now since land developers first laid eyes on 1,250 acres of forest and farmland, mainly in Fugit Township, for the plotting of a 250 acre man-made lake and the staking of 1,300 potential building sites. What was assumed would be primarily a seasonal facility for recreational reasons, surprisingly proved to be equally popular with people seeking rather a permanent rural environment.

Lake Santee has turned out to be the township's most densely populated community, in contrast to Clarksburg, some five miles away, where Fugit's fire fighting efforts are based. Lake residents have always considered themselves lucky to be within such reasonable distance of professional assistance; and have nothing but praise for their department's performance. Although four homes have been ruled total fire losses, several near disasters have been averted by the Clarksburg volunteers. Realizing, however, that a fire of even the smallest origin intensifies tremendously with each tick of the clock between detection and attention, several of Santee's most concerned citizens began to consider providing themselves with an interim measure of protection.

The new Kiwanis Club was ready to tackle its first project and this cause was surely Santee's top priority. They were sure they could raise some money; but needed someone to tend to the technicalities. Acting on the advice of five members of the Clarksburg Department who live at the Lake, several options were proposed. They weighed the cost of equipping a 3/4 ton pickup with the very minimum of trade tools, to finding a used fire truck or having one custom-made to meet their needs. In the meantime, Ray Geis, father of a firefighter and Lake marina-manager Greg, stumbled onto a sympathetic heavy duty equipment dealer who made them an offer they couldn't refuse on a used truck that could carry the kind of payload they preferred. \$2,500. bought them a seven yearold 2 1/2 ton chassis International, with extras like a 3,000 watt generator to operate flood lights and power tools, an auxiliary compressed air tank to pressurize such rescue devices as an air chisel and 100 cu. ft. of storage space.

The truck made its debut in December, something of a Christmas present to contributors thus far; but it was destined for the maintenance building where the next phase of the project was to give it a facelift.

The volunteers wound up moonlighting the winter long, first cleaning, sandblasting every part, mending the body, priming and having it painted. Piece by piece, it began to look like a fire truck. They went with the maximum size water tank the 11 ft. utility bed would allow, giving them a 413 gallon capacity. They opted for a front-mounted 500 gallons per minute pump that enables them to draw water directly from the Lake or a cistern to the fire when possible or replenish the tank and return to the scene. On the other end, the electric start pump is plumbed for portable use in case it must be carried to a water Two hose beds hold 300 ft. of 1 1/2 inch nylon hose and two electric rewind reels contain 200 ft. each of one inch booster line. Lights, ladders, a combination siren/PA system and radio equipment have since been installed.

To be complete the unit is still in need of numerous comparative little items, like various size ladders, nozzles and axes, some of which will be furnished through township fire funding as it becomes available. Emergency medical equipment will also be provided as several persons have completed or are now taking such training. Although well over \$10,000 has been spent, the club and the community are determined to cover the expenses as the drive continues. In the late going, the Lake's Board of Directors instituted a guaranteed grant of up to \$2,000., offering to match contributors dollar for dollar.

At its official unveiling, the vehicle looked like it just rolled off the assembly line; and it's likely it will continue to receive only the finest care. They figure it's worth now in the range of \$40 to \$50,000. Although the truck is stationed at the Lake, it is available for service outside Santee, so the true value of a 2-pumper department will be realized throughout the Clarksburg and surrounding districts.



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
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

Meeting of September 18, 2014 3:30 PM Lake Santee Community Room

1. Roll Call

Scott called the meeting to order and requested a roll call. Members present were Scott Gibbs, Jim Hornig, Kathy Tarzwell, Paul Gosnell, Clair Fredrickson, and Ed Fox. Absent was Greg Montgomery. Also attending were Brandon Litmer, Utility Superintendent, Brad Jones, Lake Manager and the District's attorney, Anne Poindexter.

2. Consent Items

- a. Minutes from August 21, 2014
- b. Financial Reports
- c. Registers of Claims for sewer operating
- d. Registers of Claims for water operating

A motion was made by Ed Fox and seconded by Kathy Tarzwell to accept the consent items. Motion carried.

3. Operators Report

- a. Sewer Status Report Brandon reported that the sewer plant is operating well with no issues. The State required DMR test (solids) has been re-performed and passed. Brandon had a request from the owner of lot 263 wanting to utilize a shared pump basin. This has been done a number of times at the lake and there are several things that go into approving this type of installation. The lot owner will be asked to provide additional written information related to his request. Due to all the new construction, more pumps are needed. The cost for each pump is \$1449 plus freight. Brandon stated that 4 pumps would handle our current needs, leaving 2 in reserve. A motion was made by Jim Hornig and seconded by Clair Fredrickson to buy the 4 pumps for \$1449 each plus freight. Motion carried.
- b. Water Status Report Brandon reported that the water plant is operating well with no issues. Clair asked about the commercial water usage for July and August as it appeared to be high. Brandon has talked with the campground and they had found a leak on the customer side of the meter that they believe has been repaired.
- c. Administrator Status Report Brad reported there were 119 ACH and 11 credit cards transactions this month. There were 2 shut offs and both are back on. There were two requests to fill swimming pools and actual gallons were calculated. The office will apply the adjustments per the policy.
- d. Project Task List No report this month.

4. Committee Reports

- a. Board Member Guide Committee
 - i. Board Training Topic: Brandon covered several tests that are required by the State for the water plant. Some tests are done by independent labs, along with many tests that are performed weekly in our own plant. Some samples are raw water directly from the Lake to determine additive amounts needed, many others are finished water from within the plant and from various locations throughout the distribution network. Brandon will put together a list of these tests.

5. Old Business

a. New Computer / Software for SCADA Update – We still do not have a quote from a second supplier. It was decided that we still need more information before going forward with this program. Discussion tabled until next month.

- b. Hidden Leak Adjustments Updated the status of the draft. Will continue to work on this.
- c. Insurance Policy Update Considered increasing the deductible to save on premiums, but the savings do not warrant changing our policy. Policy will stand as written.
- d. Disaster Recovery Plan No update this month. Will continue to research this.
- e. Water Disconnects The District's attorney has suggested adding language to the disconnect notices advising the customer of the opportunity to appeal the water shut off to the Board prior to the disconnection. The customer should notify the Lake Office immediately if they intend to make such an appeal.
- 6. Attorney's Report Anne discussed an e-mail that Brad received concerning refinancing of our Bonds. It was decided to look into this further to see if we might qualify. Anne will review the Bond Ordinances to determine if we are allowed to pursue this option.

7. New Business

- a. Write-Offs Brad presented two items to write off. Lot 1280 was a foreclosure with a balance of \$92.14 after the lien was paid and Lot 27 has a balance of \$439.78 that Brad believes is uncollectable. A motion was made by Ed Fox and seconded by Jim Hornig to write off these balances. Motion carried.

- d. Management Agreement It will soon be time to start work on next year's Management Agreement with the POA.
- e. Renewal of Board Member Terms Clair's and Scott's terms expire on 12/31. Both have indicated they will renew. Clair will arrange to present the names to the County.
