The Lake Office will observe winter hours beginning October 1: Monday-Friday 9:00am-4:00pm, Closed Saturday & Sunday. Evenings & Saturdays by appointment.

Now is the time to start planning to get your boats out of the lake for winter. Lowering of the lake to winter levels will begin the second week of October. Winter level will be set between 3' & 5'9" below overflow elevation. The gate will be closed again by March 1, 2015.

Reminder: Political Signs may be displayed on the property owner's lot during the period between 30 days before (Oct 5<sup>th</sup>) & 5 days (Nov 9<sup>th</sup>) after the date of the election (Nov 4<sup>th</sup>), no more than 2 signs per lot, & signs may not exceed 24"x36".

## HISTORY OF LAKE SANTEE

THE FIRST FIFTY YEARS
THE SANTEE NATION

The Santee name came from the Sioux word ISWATI which means "the river" or the "People of the River". The Santee were first encountered by the Spanish in the early 17th century along the middle course of what is now the Santee River in South Carolina. In 1700 the Santee plantations stretched for miles along the river. A war with the coast People, which the Santee were losing soon changed their lives, but did not break their spirits.



Some of the Santee were captured and deported to


Haiti; another large group of Santee fled to the Ohio Valley, then onward as part of the Sioux tribe to Wisconsin, Minnesota and Southern Canada where the Santee were encountered by French explorers late in the 17th century in the Mille-Lacs region of Minnesota.

In the Treaty of 1837 the Santee were forced to cede all of their Minnesota lands to the Government except for their reservation. Confined to the reservation, the Santee were at the mercy of dishonest traders, incompetent Government agents and squatters. Numerous incidents finally led to an uprising in 1862 which went badly for the Santee. All of their lands were expropriated and they fled to the Dakotas and Canada. In 1866 the Santee were moved to their reservation in Nebraska. Though small in number and beset with many adversities, their indomitable spirit kept them together.

The Santee name is kept alive by the Santee River and Nature Preserve in South Carolina, the Santee reservation in Nebraska and, of course, Lake Santee in Decatur County, Indiana.



Ideas for where to donate club monies were presented and will be discussed in further detail at upcoming meetings.



He asked about the amount of dog warnings as opposed to citations and asked that something be done to take care of this perceived problem.

Neil Jackman asked for clarification on a bill and what exactly we are paying for. Dick clarified the bill and explained that the money went toward financial reports.

Keriann Slaby-Lee spoke on the new women's group that she is president of, Ladies of the Lake. The one goal is to support local troops and servicemen. Keriann read the mission statement and expressed desire to help the Recreation Committee and work with them on several of the scheduled events as well as add extra activities to these events (pet parade, electric golf cart parade). The ladies' group also asked to be placed under Lake Santee's umbrella of Not-for-Profit organization. Dick Veach clarified that Lake Santee is not a 5013C organization and is considered a Not-for-Profit Corporation therefore pays taxes. Mr. Veach did ask for a copy of their and mission statement so that he can present that to the board.

Dick thanked everyone for their comments and assured them that the issues would be addressed.

Brad stated there was no correspondence to report this month.

**Rules & Regulations – Polly Fox** 

Polly presented the second reading of changes to amend Rule 15.3 to reflect the actual size of the Community Room facility and occupancy as required by the Fire Marshal since its remodel.

- a) The community room is 28 x 40.75 feet in size, or 1,141 square feet.
- i) Occupancy of the community room is limited to 76 persons.

Second reading was approved on a motion by Mike Cutrufelli and seconded by John Lecher. The motion was carried on second reading. After hearing no objections or changes, Dick Veach offered the rule changes up for the third and final reading. The changes to the rule was unanimously approved on a motion by Mike Cutrufelli and seconded by John Lecher.

Mike Cutrufelli reported that the next event on the calendar would be a bass tournament on September 21 beginning at 7:00 am with weigh-ins at 10:00 am and 2:00 pm. Mike stated that the lake has committed to purchase water and awards for the event. Coffee, tea, and cocoa will be available.

Mike also discussed other calendar events coming up. October 18 with be the Autumn Family Bonfire at 6:00 pm, trick or treat times will be October 25<sup>th</sup> from 5:00-8:00 pm for the community. Mike is also planning a Trunk or Treat Contest in October as well.

The recreation committee will be holding a planning meeting for the 50<sup>th</sup> Golden Jubliee on October 30 at 7:00 pm in the community room with additional meetings to come. Full list of events is available

#### Lakes & Beaches – Larry Foster

Larry discussed that dredging was complete and how many loads were taken from the lake. Larry would like the lake board to reevaluate their thinking and consider a wetland project as opposed to a dredging project. A plan will come and be presented to the board at a later date.

Dick informed the board that there was a previous building permit approved for a garage that was not built to code. This was a building committee error and therefore the property owner does not need to make any adjustments but the board has put safeguards in place to ensure compliance for future use.

#### Clean Up – Jim Massingale

Jim stated that the clean-up committee took a tour on August 14. Three first letters, two second letters and three thank you letters were sent to members not in compliance. There are 13 properties on watch and seven properties on continuous watch.

There was some discussion over what constitutes a watch or a letter and how the committee decides what properties are not in compliance. The board stated that people could find all the compliance rules in the Lake Santee Rules and Regulations brochure.

#### Roads & Maintenance - Ron Day

Ron discussed that he had the opportunity to spend a couple of days with Brandon Litmer and began by commending our maintenance staff on all that they do at the lake and the water district. Ron said that now that dredging is complete, the crew has a full staff again to compete mowing and trimming. There had been some issues with the mowing of the dam and that will be monitored closely. The construction of the bandstand should be under way and completed by the end of October. There was also some discussion over the silt compilation on the north end of the lake. There have been some issues with run-off and slick spots due to the silt on the roads. The staff will be working on cleaning up this area.

A member asked if there would be more chip and seal done on other roads. Dick discussed that feedback on how those roads are holding up is vital. Members seemed thrilled with the chip and seal and next year the board will discuss working out finances to get more chip and seal completed in place of gravel. Discussion was also had about whose responsibility it is to trim around the clusters of mailboxes, cleaning out culverts and standing water. Ron will be touring the lake grounds with Brandon and will look into these issues with maintenance.

#### **Security – John Lecher**

John reported that there was a repair of the security truck, which was under warranty and was taken care of. Full report will be in the Smoke Signal. John did warn members to be on the look out for people stealing gas out of boats. He stated there have been a couple of thefts thus far and members should call security if they see anything suspicious.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

No old business at this time.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

No new business at this time.

#### **MANAGER'S REPORT**

Brad reported that Letts fire department had requested to add the lake on a benefit UTV ride that they are doing on October 18. The group would be coming into the lake through the back gate and escorted by a sheriff deputy through the lake with the possibility of stopping at the Sea Shack for some refreshments. After a great deal of discussion the board put the request to a vote. The request was granted on a 5:4 majority vote.

Brad reported that the Lake office was able to collect \$965.31 for a write-off debt as well as \$928.40 for past due monies on that same account, and \$672.36 for bad debt, with a total of \$2,566.07 collected funds. Brad was able to reduce the cell phone bill by a total of \$331.32 for the year (about \$27.61 per month).

There being no further business, Mike Cutrufelli moved to adjourn, seconded by Ron Day, motion carried. The next regular meeting will be held on October 8, 2014 at 7:30 PM in the Community Room.



#### **Attention Absentee Home Owners**

Homeowners would be well advised to turn off their water while away. Homeowners are prohibited from operating the water meter valve or removing and/or loosening the meter to drain lines. All customers are required by the rules to have their own valves in place to valve off and drain their homes as necessary. If you want the District to also turn off the meter valve, we will be happy to do so, however the District will not be held liable for meter valves that are not 100% tight. You are advised not to depend solely on the meter valve. The charge for valving is \$10.00 during regular work hours of 7:30 AM to 4:00 PM, \$20.00 after hours. The same charges apply to valves turned on. The District cannot turn on water to a home unless the customer has a valve closed to protect the home or a responsible adult is present.

#### **Homeowners Pumps**

Your grinder pump is not a garbage disposal. The following items should not be put in your system: Glass metal, diapers, socks, rags, cloth, plastics, sanitary napkins, tampons, explosives, flammable materials, lubricating oils or grease, strong chemicals, gasoline, sand, gravel, fish scales, cleaning fluids, pesticides, herbicides and toxic chemicals. The District owns the grinder station and customers are not permitted to open the tank or control panel.

If the red light on the electric box for your grinder pump is on, it means your pump is not working properly. During regular business hours call the office at 527-2943. After regular hours call 560-1157 if you see your light or your neighbors' light on.

A district employee will respond promptly. Also remember, there is an ordinance that prohibits the planting of trees, flowers, shrubs or other plantings within five feet of the station to allow accessibility. In addition no plantings shall be placed on the side of the pump facing the nearest road to promote visibility of the visual alarm from the roadway. Painting of the control panel or pump tank is prohibited.

### Lake Santee Regional Waste and Water District Customers

You have the option of having your water bill payments made by automatic withdrawal from your checking or savings account. This can be for the water user accounts as well as the availability accounts. The forms may be obtained from the office or downloaded from our website. You must be logged in on the website, go to Utilities, click on the water tab and it is the last form on the list.
