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

PROPERTY OWNERS ASSOCIATION TEAM BASS TOURNAMENTS

Official Rules

- 1. All Lake Santee rules and bylaws will be followed.
- 2. There will be a mandatory meeting FIFTEEN (15) minutes prior to the start of the tournament at the Lake Santee Main Beach Shelter. Those teams not entered prior to the meeting will be disqualified unless prior arrangements have been made with tournament official(s).
- 3. Boat positions will be determined at the mandatory meeting by a number draw. The start will be a continual "ooze off" of boats by the position drawn.
- 4. A mandatory boat check will be conducted prior to the start of the tournament.

 All boats must be equipped with an aerated livewell capable of sustaining a limit of bass.
- 5. Safe boating must be observed at all times. <u>Each participant is required to wear a USCG approved life preserver</u> and the kill switch should be working properly any time the combustion engine is in operation prior to and during tournament hours.
- 6. Only largemouth, smallmouth, and spotted (Kentucky) will be counted towards the daily limit of five (5) bass per team. Only artificial baits may be utilized in competition, including pork type trailers.
- 7. Only bass measuring sixteen (16) inches or longer will be weighed. The official board will be the Golden Rule. No short fish will be counted towards daily limit. The penalty for weighing short fish will be the weight of short fish plus two (2) ounces per fish deducted from the total of the legal fish that are weighed in.
- 8. No dead bass will be counted. All bass must be released in healthy condition. Any bass which fails to swim away upon release will be scored as a dead fish and the weight of that fish plus eight (8) ounces will be deducted from that teams' remaining weight.
- 9. Participants will not be allowed to leave the boat during tournament hours. Participants may briefly leave the boat for an exigent emergency or answer the "call of nature".
- 10. All ties will be determined by combining the prizes and dividing it equally between the respective teams. All protests must be made in writing within **TEN** (10) minutes of tournament conclusion.
- 11. No cheating will be tolerated and contestants may only use artificial baits during competition.
- 12. Competitors are expected to follow a high standard of sportsmanship, safety, and conservation. Alcohol and abused drugs will not be consumed during tournament hours.
- 13. The Tournament will be a two (2) man team style format. At least one member of each team must be an L.S.P.O.A. member in good standing. Members may fish alone and be considered a team.

Try listening for what you can hear. Birds singing and calling? Yes! Spring is on its way!



OLD BUSINESS

Lake treatment

The board discussed and voted on the lake maintenance contract. In the executive session the board decided to grant the contract to our current provider, Aquatic Control. The board discussed the extra testing that had been discussed. Aquatic Control has agreed to test initially for free and it would be a minimal charge for additional tests. Mike Cutrufelli made moved to accept the Aquatic Control contract with the addition of testings. Carol Goodwin seconded the motion. The vote passed with an 8:1 vote.

Carol Goodwin moved to accept the contract of Aquatic Control to complete a fish count as well. Ron Day seconded the motion. The vote unanimously passed. There was some discussion about the health of the lake, future issues, and what treatments will be used to fix the problem. The board stated that it is still researching various treatments and cures for the nitrate issue as well as the algae. The board also discussed looking into some controlled plantings to help aid in the treatment.

NEW BUSINESS

ETC

ETC is looking for approval to place a hut as well as 4 cabinets within the association property to run fiber optic lines to provide a host of services to the lake residences. The lines would be above ground throughout the community and place on the electric poles, and then ran underground to each individual home. Services provided would include Internet, home security, phone, and cable to list a few. ETC will be presenting to the public at the March meeting.

Sale of section of 1529

A member who currently owns lots 1530, 1528, and 1527 would like to purchase a sliver of land owned by the association on lot 1529. The property owner has been maintaining the property for a while and it lies between his existing lots. Carol Goodwin made a motion to allow the owner to purchase this section for \$500 and pay all associated expenses, with the stipulation that the board is not setting a precedent in doing so. Jim Massingale seconded the motion and it passed.

Brad presented several lots that were purchased at tax sale the need to be approved for write off. Lots 1638, 1639, 1640, 949, 757, 758, 482, and 735 totaling \$4,537.09. After some discussion about the lots and verification that the lots currently have for sale signs on them Carol Goodwin made a motion that after March 1, 2015 the lots can be subject to write off. John Lecher seconded and the motion passed.

Brad presented a contract from Circle City Pyrotechnics for the 2015 fireworks display. The contract is very similar to years past; a 20-25 minute display costing \$5000 to be held on July 4 with a rain date of July 5, 2015. Mike Cutrufelli moved to accept the bid and Ron Day seconded. Vote passed.

1. Roll Call

Scott called the meeting to order and requested a roll call. Members present were Scott Gibbs, Clair Fredrickson, Jim Hornig, Greg Montgomery, and Paul Gosnell. Absent were Kathy Tarzwell and Ed Fox. Also attending were Brad Jones, Utility Administrator and Brandon Litmer, Utility Superintendent.

Election of Officers for 2015

Scott presented the slate of the current officers to repeat for 2015. He then asked for nominations from the floor. There being none, a motion was made by Jim and seconded by Greg to accept the current slate. Motion carried. The current officers will remain for 2015 as follows: President – Scott Gibbs; Vice-President – Clair Fredrickson; Secretary – Paul Gosnell; Treasurer – Kathy Tarzwell.

3. Consent Items

- a. Minutes from December 18, 2014
- b. Financial Reports
- c. Register of Claims for sewer operating
- d. Register of Claims for water operating

A motion was made by Jim and seconded by Greg to accept the consent items with the following corrections: add Paul Gosnell's name to roll call of the December meeting; correct the spelling of the word since to sense in Item 5.e. Motion carried.

4. Operators Report

- a. Sewer Status Report Brandon reported that the Sewer Plant was operating on a normal basis with no problems and all tests normal.
- b. Water Status Report Brandon reported that the Water Plant was operating on a normal basis with no problems and all tests normal. A water line that crosses under the lake had been damaged during construction of a new dock earlier in the month, and has been repaired with a minimal amount of disruption of service.
- c. Administrator Status Report Brad reported there were 117 ACHs and 12 credit card payments last month. There were 6 valve turns and 8 shut offs, with 1 still off at this time. Brad corrected a couple of formulae in the Management Agreement spreadsheet which increased the water portion cost by \$611 and the sewer portion by \$231for 2015.

5. Committee Reports

- a. Board Member Guide Committee
 - i. Board Training Topic Brandon and Scott reviewed the "Safe Drinking Water Contingency Plan in Case an Emergency Exists" document. We are required to update this plan at least annually. Brandon will update and distribute.

6. Old Business

- a. Hidden Leak Adjustments The third draft of the proposed changes and additions to the Ordinance was discussed with several good suggestions revolving around fair time frames for repairs and adjustment requests. Scott will incorporate the new language for review at the next meeting.
- b. Disaster Recovery Plan Additional discussions have been held with the Napoleon Water District and they have expressed a strong interest in partnering with us for a backup program in case of a disaster crippling our ability to furnish water to our customers. It was decided that Ed Fox will continue to be our contact with them.
- c. Bond Refunding Brad read an email from Buzz Krohn about our financial status utilizing updated 2014 numbers, which were more favorable than the prorated amounts he had to

use in December. Since it does appear we have the appropriate coverage ratios, we will have Buzz continue working with the bidders to obtain updated proposals and perform new evaluations of those proposals.

8. New Business

All customers are required by the rules to have their own valves in place to valve off and drain their homes as necessary. If you want the District to also turn off the meter valve, we will be happy to do so, however the District will not be held liable for meter valves that are not 100% tight. You are advised not to depend solely on the meter valve. The charge for valving is \$10.00 during regular work hours of 7:30 AM to 4:00 PM, \$20.00 after hours. The same charges apply to valves turned on. The District cannot turn on water to a home unless the customer has a valve closed to protect the home or a responsible adult is present.

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You have the option of having your water bill payments made by automatic withdrawal from your checking or savings account. This can be for the water user accounts as well as the availability accounts. The forms may be obtained from the office or downloaded from our website. You must be logged in on the website, go to Utilities, click on the water tab and it is the last form on the list.
