LAKE SANTE BASS TOURNAMENT JULY 19th. 2015

On Sunday, July 19th, the fourth bass tournament of the 2015 season was held at beautiful Lake Santee. Thirteen teams showed up to take part in the event, which began under cloudy skies with a humidity of over 90%. To say it was hot and sticky was an understatement!

The husband/wife team of Don and Bonnie Mohr definitely didn't let the uncomfortable conditions stop them from weighing in the largest limit of bass from our lake in over TEN years. The pair's five bass weighed 20 lb. 12 oz. and included a 5.99 lb. big bass that Bonnie caught! A limit that large has not been weighed in since before the devastating bass kill from the mid 2000's!! This goes to further prove that Lake Santee's fishing is continuing to improve every year with everyone's combined efforts and management practices. Philip and Dustin Miller combined to take second place in the derby and the brothers five bass limit weighed 18 lb. 8 oz. Third place went to the team of Chuck Sieg and Paul Bruns with a five bass limit totaling 16.95 lb.

However, these totals tell just a portion of the story. Anglers combined to weigh in 49 keeper bass which weighed over 153 pounds with an average weight of over 3 pounds each. In addition, seven trophy bass over four pounds were weighed in. We are also happy to announce that each bass was released alive back into Lake Santee to each be caught again by some lucky angler!

Jack and Betty Kerner at Angler's World in Greenfield continued their great support of our events by not only sponsoring the two door prizes but also the plaques for the event. Thank you Jack and Betty!!!

As stated above, Lake Santee is, without a doubt, one of the finest bass fisheries in the entire Midwest. As many are aware, this notoriety can only help increase the property values as word spreads throughout the fishing world. Please help the bass fishermen and women continue to improve YOUR lake by following their lead and PRACTICING CATCH AND RELEASE on all of Lake Santee's bass and remember to take a child fishing! 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Lake Santee Property Owners Association, Inc Annual Meeting Minutes August 9, 2015

The members of the Lake Santee Property Owners Association (LSPOA) met for their annual meeting on Sunday, August 9, 2015 at 2:00 pm in the community room. The meeting was called to order by President Dick Veach. Other board members present were Polly Ann Fox, Angel Hocker, Ron Day, Mike Cutrufelli, Carol Goodwin, Jim Massingale, and John Lecher. Larry Foster was not present at the meeting. Lake Santee employees present were Brad Jones, Lake Manager, and Brandon Litmer, Maintenance Supervisor.

Dick gave an opening statement concerning the history behind Lake Santee being granted a corporate charter in May of 1965 and that the lake operates under the Corporate Charter of that date as well as the governing by-laws approved, adopted, and amended by all members in good standing effective September 1, 2007. Dick noted that we are here for the LSPOA annual member meeting prescribed by those by-laws for the purpose of electing Directors and transacting any other business that may arise as a part of the meeting. Dick noted the responsibilities of the Directors and explained the importance of the vote today. Angel Hocker, Board Secretary/Treasurer, read the minutes of the previous annual meeting held August 10, 2014. The minutes were approved on a motion by Carol Goodwin and seconded by Mike Cutrufelli Angel then presented the financial report for the past fiscal year ending February 2015 as compiled by Alerding and Company. Dick explained that Mike Farmer of Alerding and Company was not able to be present at today's meeting and opened the floor to questions concerning the report. Dick thanked Mr. Farmer and informed the members that there are copies of the report available at the meeting or can be picked up in the office.

Polly Ann Fox, Vice President and Rules and Regulations Chairman, gave a report on the year's actions of the rules committee. Polly reported that the committee added and or amended only a few rules this past year. Amendments were made to section 15.3 which was to adjust the size of the community room within the rules, and section 12.5 which was to disallow any type of tree house built within the subdivision. New rules written fell under section 16 concerning the new amphitheater, its use, and regulations surrounding it as well as section 13.9 which restricts construction parking on Santee Drive during school bus hours. This is to ensure the safety of our school children as they get on and off the buses.

Jim Massingale, Clean-up Committee Chair reported that the clean-up committee is comprised of Board member Jim Massingale, resident Duane McKinley as well as Lake Manager, Brad Jones. Jim began by thanking the community for keeping the subdivision clean and looking great. Jim stated that everyone did a great job of keeping things nice especially for the 50th Anniversary Celebration. In an effort to keep the community a beautiful place to live and visit the committee tours the area about twice a month. For the 2014-2015 year, the committee sent out 152 letters. Of this 152, 48 were thank you letters for the quick response to the noted problem. 76 were first letters, 21 were second letters, 6 were third letters and 1 was a fourth letter.

Jim also presented a report as the Building Committee Chair. Mr. Massingale reported that there were 64 total permits issued within the past year for various projects. Two permits were granted for new homes, 12 for docks, and 1 was issued for the construction of the new amphitheater. The building committee is comprised of Brad Jones, Brandon Litmer and Jim Massingale.

Mike Cutrufelli. Recreation Director, thanked everyone for all of their help in making the 50th Anniversary a huge success. The planning meetings started during the fall and continued through to the event. In October/November of last year the Ladies of the Lake saved the day with the Pet Parade and the Lake had yet another successful Trick or Treat. Mike stated that the recreation committee "went dark" during the months of January and February. Things picked up again in spring with a speedy yet successful Easter

Egg Hunt. The entire thing lasted less than 4 minutes, start to finish. Mike also stated that next month he has already scheduled a bonfire on the beach along with some music. More info to come.

Ron Day, Chair of Roads and Maintenance, thanked our maintenance crew for all of their hard work this past year especially for putting up with him this year. Ron went through a few of the duties the crew completed this past year. The department purchased 700 tons of gravel to upgrade and maintain the secondary roads. The crew worked while the Lake was down to expand and improve the boat ramps at the marina. The maintenance crew worked at the design and building of the community's new Amphitheater and completed this project within the time constraints of the 50th Anniversary Celebration. The North gate was opened and the crew worked at making sure the entrance was fit for the community to use.

Ron gave a special Thank You to the Lake Santee Regional Waste and Water District for granting a licensing agreement for the trial period to determine if there would be interest in a north entrance to the lake community.

Carol Goodwin, Membership Chairman, announced that LSPOA received 59 new memberships from August of 2014 through July of 2015.

As Community Room Chair, Carol also announced that the renovations were all completed and the occupancy limits were adjusted accordingly. The overhead deck has a new metal underlayment that provides weather protection so that the area can be used as an extension to the community room. The HVAC system has been replaced and is working well. Carol stated that the most notable new addition is the amphitheater resplendent with landscaping. Carol thanked both the Women's Club and the Booster Club for their donations and gifts to complete these projects.

John Lecher, Security Chairman, thanked the security team for all of their efforts this year. Yearlong members of the Security staff include Joe Jarman, Jim Horning, and Vicki Schrader. Jed Barnett was on the security team until he moved in December. Cathy Hankins joined the staff in January to fill the vacant position and then in May, Dean Cliff was added to the team as backup. The Security team patrolled 28,170 miles and was on call 24/7. The highest call volumes included 74 golf cart inspections, 70 dog calls, 34 assists to members and 22 assists to law enforcement, fire department, and EMS. John also thanked the gate and beach guards. John reported that speed limit signs were added to Santee Drive in lieu of painting the speed limit on the roads and placed to high traffic areas along the gravel or secondary roads. Mr. Lecher thanked the membership for their cooperation this year.

In Larry Foster's absence, Dick Veach gave an impromptu report of the Lakes and Beaches Committee. Dick first addressed the issue of dredging and explained that due to its costly nature, the board has decided to dredge every other year instead of annually. Dick also noted that although he was not sure on numbers, the lake was stocked very similarly to last year. Dick also stated that the board had signed a contract with Aquatic Control to take care of any algae or other issues. In this contract the board had asked for a pre and post test to determine treatment success

Mr. Veach commended all of the clubs and organizations that do so much for our community and to continually improve the lake. Dick opened the floor to anyone who wanted to speak on behalf of their clubs.

Paul Gosnell stated that it was an extremely busy year for the Booster Club and that the club has seen a lot of growth. July was the biggest issue the Smoke Signal has ever put out. There were a few problems with

production that they have been trying to alleviate. The due date for anything needing to be included in the Smoke Signal is being moved up to the 18th of the month to give the group some extra time to get it all together. Paul stated that they are looking for new and interesting things to put in the monthly additions. They would like to start a student/school section to honor our local students in what they are doing in school. Paul also said he is looking for help. If interested, please let him know.

Nancy stated that they are also looking for more advertisers. She suggests that if you know someone who does not advertise or someone does work for you, direct them towards the Smoke Signals.

Friends of Wildlife Group- Dick announced that there is a new Monarch Butterfly Habitat. During the 50th celebration the group had small animals and birds back in the wildlife preserve from Utopia.

Women's Club- The ladies announced that they raised \$5000 at the annual auction on August 8, 2015. Although the group has recently lost the ability to hold a raffle, the community supported the group at the auction and the ladies give a big thanks.

Ladies of the Lake- Keriann spoke about all of the successful activities at the 50th celebration including all of the children's activities. The group has officially hit the 1 year anniversary and would like to thank residents for their support.

Bass Club- Dick stated that the bass tournaments were a success this year and lots of big fish were caught.

Book Club- The book club works with the library and has regularly scheduled meetings.

Kiwanis- The Kiwanis do a lot for the community and the lake. The annual Hog Roast had, as always, a huge turnout. The local Boy Scout group helped sponsor and work this event.

Greensburg Breakfast Optimist Club- Rick Johnson stated that Tom and Jeri Russell have recently moved to the Carolinas. Ed Fox is now a new member of the group. The Optimists handle the flags at the entrance. If you would like to help fund, it is a 1-3 year commitment. See Ed or Rick.

Clarksburg Volunteer Fire Department- The new station is complete and up and running. Station #2 has two vehicles; the station purchased a new engine last year. They have also purchased a Tahoe SUV for use as a medical vehicle. This has gotten lots of use already. At present time the station is working on getting its ISO certification. This would potentially help lower insurance rates 18-20%. The crew is working on mapping water availability with the DNR and has agreements with surrounding stations.

CERT Team- Ron Day stated that the team is looking for more people to participate. Greensburg now has a separate CERT team which is also available to us in case of disaster. The local high schools have CERT teams trained as well. The CERT team does a lot for the community other than natural disasters.

50th Jubilee Committee- Thank all of the committees mentioned for their help in making the celebration grand. Also, thank you to Nancy Fredrickson and Shannon Gibbs for all of their work on the history of the Lake and the creation of the books

YMCA- Diane Hart thanked Brandon and Brad for their help on the Triathlon. The YMCA is holding another event on September 12, 2015 and are looking for volunteers. They will also be holding a Duathlon for those not wanting to swim (run-bike-run). Also be prepared to see bicyclers heading around the lake on August 29th for the Tree City Rolling Tour.

Election Committee Report- Nancy Fredrickson thanked Cindy Fowler and Sharon Kobeske.

Nancy explained that there are 775 property owners, 719 ballots were mailed out to owners in good standing and only 265 were returned along with 7 proxies, and 5 voided.

Results for three year terms are as follows:

Vicki Wilson 120

Runners up in order are Pam Kachur, Michael Dora and Douglas Butt.

Dick opened the meeting up to questions from the floor. The board fielded questions from the audience.

*A member asked if the Board had looked into electronic gates. Dick replied that we had not. Another member stated that he and his partner would be happy to donate access control for gates. All electronics would be able to remote open the gates and members would be responsible for the cost of the key fob. *A member asked if a permanent back entrance location had been finalized. Dick explained that the Board has approached RWWD for a long term agreement. We are currently awaiting their decision. The Lake only owns that land up to a certain point and therefore have no rights to it. If RWWD grants the Board use, we will begin a more permanent entrance/exit as well as beautifying that area.

- *A member asked if water bills will decrease with the addition of all the new homes. Dick explained that the RWWD is separate from the LSPOA and that question would need to be asked of them.
- *A member asked for an update on ETC. Dick stated that ETC will be hosting a meet and greet in the Community Room on August 22 from 9-11 am. They will be signing customers up with services at this time.
- *A member asked about chip and seal or paving of back roads. Dick explained that the Board is looking into some more cost efficient means of taking care of the secondary roads. We are looking into millings like were used on the recycle center, as well as chip and seal and rejuvenation of existing blacktop roads. The rejuvenation process should extend the life of our roads allowing us to use those funds to take care of secondary roads.
- *A member asked what the smelly black substance is that was spread on gravel roads. Dick explained that is a tree sap type substance used as dust control.
- * A member asked if the new state legislative bill will exempt the lake from some of the property taxes. Dick explained that in 2011 LSPOA started the process of going over our properties and getting those taxes reduced. At present taxes paid has decreased from around \$33,000 to \$6,000. The Lake may be eligible for some refunds on certain years.

Dick thanked John Lecher and Larry Foster for their service to the Lake Santee Community and the Board of Directors. He stated that they will both be missed.

Dick then asked all newly elected Board Members to stay and have a short meeting with existing members. The meeting was adjourned on a motion by Mike Cutrufelli, seconded by Carol Goodwin.

MEMBER INTRODUCTIONS AND COMMENTS

Members were asked to introduce themselves and were given the opportunity to express comments.

Jenni Hanna briefly spoke about the updates to ETC. Dick asked her to stay around and talk more in detail when we get to ETC in the old business section of the meeting.

CORRESPONDENCE

Brad announced that the lake had a couple of pieces of correspondence this month. One piece was a misunderstanding and not required to be read aloud in the meeting. The other piece, the board decided would be handled by a committee for further study.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Rules & Regulations – Polly Ann Fox

Polly commenced with the third reading of rule 16 concerning the amphitheater. The rule was completely read aloud fulfilling the third and final reading requirements.

AMPHITHEATER

16.1 WHO MAY USE:

- a) The Association Board may reserve the Amphitheater for events as needed.
- b) Lake Santee clubs and organizations may reserve the Amphitheater for Board approved events.

- c) Members in good standing may reserve the Amphitheater for approved activities.
 - d) The Amphitheater is not available to the general public, unless approved by the Board of Directors.

16.2 ACTIVITIES PERMITTED

- a) All activities shall be conducted in compliance with all applicable federal, state and local laws, as well as within the Rules and Regulations of the Association.
- b) Any activity judged by the Board to be destructive to the facilities or to be otherwise improper shall not be permitted.
- c) The Board of Directors reserves the right to refuse any individual, club, or organization the right to use the Amphitheater.
- d) Any activity at which food, drink, or other items are offered for sale, or at which admission or cover charges are contemplated must have prior approval of the Board.

16.3 FACILITIES AVAILABLE

- a) The Amphitheater is hexagon 31' at the widest x 15'6" maximum depth in size, or 305.78 square feet.
- b) Handicap accessible restrooms are available within the Beach restroom.

16.4 HOURS

- a) Sunday through Thursday: all activities shall cease prior to 10:00 p.m. (cleanup may continue quietly).
- b) Friday and Saturday: All activities shall cease prior to 12:00 midnight (cleanup may continue quietly).
- c) The hours may be extended by the Board of Directors for special functions.

16.5 FEES & DEPOSITS

- a) All functions of the Association, their designated committees, and Lake Santee clubs and organizations may be permitted without charge, unless special permit fees are required.
- b) Functions limited to three hours or less shall be charged \$45.00 rental and \$45.00 damage deposit, plus any applicable permit or legally required fees.
- c) Daytime functions of more than three hours duration and concluding prior to 6:00 p.m. shall be charged \$115.00 rental and \$115.00 damage deposit, plus any applicable permit or legally required fees.

- d) Functions beginning after 6:00 p.m. of more than three hours duration shall be charged \$125.00 rental and \$125.00 damage deposit, plus any applicable permit or legally required fees.
- e) Functions running through the afternoon and continuing past 6:00 p.m. shall be charged \$175.00 rental and \$175.00 damage deposit plus any applicable permit or legally required fees.
- f) All monies shall be collected by personnel in the Lake Santee Office.
- g) Damage deposit will be refunded within 48 hours of function, but not until the facilities have been thoroughly inspected. Deposit will have to be picked up at the Lake Santee Office or received by mail as requested.
- h) If inspection reveals incomplete cleanup including outside trash containers, and time allows, renter will be contacted for immediate follow up action. Otherwise, cleanup will be completed by lake personnel who will be paid with all or part of the damage deposit as necessary.
- i) If inspection reveals damage exceeding normal wear and tear, renter be contacted to discuss and view damage. All or part of the damage deposit will be applied to replace items or repair items damaged as deemed necessary by the Lake Office personnel or the Board.

16.6 SCHEDULING

- a) All scheduling shall be done by personnel in the Lake Santee Office during regular office hours.
- b) A calendar of events and reservations will be available in the office.
- c) The Association Board, and Lake Santee clubs, and organizations may schedule the Amphitheater up to one year in advance.
- d) Members may reserve the Amphitheater up to six months in advance.
- e) A contract must be completed and signed at the time a reservation is made requiring a rental fee. A copy of the contract and rules will be provided to the renter.
- f) The rental fee is due at the time of contract signing and the damage deposit is due 48 hours prior to the approved event.
- g) Full refunds of advance rental will be given for cancellations made fourteen (14) days or more prior to the date reserved. Within the fourteen days of the reserved date, refunds will be given only when cancellation is due to uncontrollable circumstances. The decision to refund is to be made by the Lake Santee Lake personnel or the Board.

16.7 DECORATING

- a) No nails, staples, tacks, or tape are to be used on walls ceilings, or trim.
- b) No open flames will be used in or around the Amphitheater
- c) If scheduling permits, decorating may be done in advance of reservation time.

16.8 CLEANUP

- a) The Amphitheater and surrounding area shall be cleaned. The cleanliness of each should meet or surpass the conditions prior to use.
- b) The area surrounding the Amphitheater must be policed for litter resulting from the function.
- c) All trash must be removed prior to leaving the area of the Amphitheater, and disposed of by persons in charge.
- d) Final cleanup may be completed the following morning if prior approval is received, no events are scheduled and cleanup is completed by 10:00am
- e) Trash bags and cleaning supplies are the responsibility of the renter.
- f) Follow the prepared checklist when cleaning.

16.9 EQUIPMENT USAGE

a) Tables, chairs, and other equipment shall not be removed from the community room for use in connection with the Amphitheater.

16.10 GENERAL PROVISIONS

- a) Amphitheater hours require the presence of a responsible adult supervisor.
- b) The member scheduling the rental function must attend that function.
- c) No wet swimsuits will be permitted in the Amphitheater
- d) No pets are allowed.
- e) No minors will be permitted without adult supervision.
- f) If the user/renter needs equipment at the Amphitheater for an event that requires delivery by vehicle to the site, such vehicles may be driven to the site for unloading and loading if the condition of the site is favorable. All vehicles must be returned to the parking lot or a designated area after unloading or loading. Unloading or loading at the site should be kept as short as possible however in no case be longer than two (2) hours. Site conditions will be determined prior to any event by the Lake office.
- g) Any member misusing the Amphitheater or allowing misuse of the Amphitheater shall be denied future use of the facilities for a period to be determined by the Board

16.11 ENFORCEMENT OF THE AMPHITHEATER RULES & REGULATIONS

- a) Enforcement is the primary responsibility of the sponsoring organization or member.
- b) Enforcement may be by any Board Member, Lake Santee employee, Lake Santee Security, or member of the office staff
- c) Where punitive action is deemed necessary by any of the above or the Association Board of Directors, enforcement shall be as provided for in the Association By-laws, under RULES, REGULATIONS AND LEGAL COMMITTEE.

The rule passed on a motion by Carol Goodwin and seconded by Mike Cutrufelli.

Polly then proceeded with the 2nd reading of rule 12.5 forbidding the construction of any type of treehouse.

12.5 A complete set of construction plans, including floor plans, exterior elevations, and a list of materials for foundation, siding and roofing shall be required for houses or house additions. Houses will not be approved without one or more of the following features: more than four corners, one or more roof valleys, dormers, or a covered porch of at least 100 square feet. No treehouse or freestanding, elevated structure shall be permitted in the Subdivision. The Building Committee will not approve two houses of similar exterior design in one area.

The amendment was accepted on a motion by Carol Goodwin and seconded by Ron Day. Upon having no modifications and the rule passing on 2nd reading, Polly was able to move to the third and final reading. The amendment passed on a motion by Carol Goodwin, seconded by Ron Day.

Polly was also able to present rule 13.19 concerning construction vehicles on Santee Drive during school bus pick-up and drop off for the second reading.

13.19 No person shall park construction trucks, equipment or trailers on Santee Drive between the hours of 7:00 am to 9:00 am and 3:00 pm to 5:00 pm on school days.

The amendment was accepted on a motion by Carol Goodwin and seconded by Mike Cutrufelli. Upon having no modifications and the rule passing on 2nd reading, Polly was able to move to the third and final reading. The amendment passed on a motion by Carol Goodwin, seconded by Mike Cutrufelli.

All three of these amendments or additions will be added to the Lake Santee Rules and Regulations.

Recreation - Carol Goodwin

Carol reported that the lake will be holding a bonfire at 6:00 pm on September 12, 2015. There will also be a band on the beach this same evening (Captain Dan Mobley).

Carol also announced that on October 17 the Ladies of the Lake are asking to sponsor a Pet Parade. Along with this event would be the local boys scouts who will be facilitating a flag burning for all people who need to respectfully dispose of old flags. Dick explained this needs to go before the board and put to a vote because this is sponsored by a specific group outside of the board. The activity was approved on a motion by Carol Goodwin and seconded by Ron Day. The lake will be providing music on this evening.

The Lake will also be hosting the annual Trick or Treat and/or Trunk or Treat, date to be announced.

Lake Santee Regional Waste & Water District Meeting Minutes

Meeting of July 16, 2015 3:30 PM Lake Santee Community Room

1. Roll Call

Scott Gibbs called the meeting to order and requested a roll call. Members present were Scott Gibbs, Clair Fredrickson, Jim Hornig, Greg Montgomery, Ed Fox, Kathy Tarzwell, and Paul Gosnell. Also attending were Brad Jones, Utility Administrator and Buzz Krohn.

2. Consent Items

- a. Minutes from June 18, 2015
- b. Financial Reports
- c. Register of Claims for sewer operating
- d. Register of Claims for water operating

A motion was made by Ed Fox and seconded by Kathy Tarzwell to accept the consent items as presented. Motion carried.

3. Operator's Report

- a. Sewer Status Report: In Brandon's absence, Brad gave the report. The sewer plant is operating well with no issues at this time.
- b. Water Status Report: The water plant is operating well. Re-pinned the membrane in a couple of spots and found two modules that could not be repinned. New ones were ordered and have been installed. Pressure decay test is now in the normal operating range. Complaints were received on July 1st. about having cloudy water in a few houses near the water tower. It was determined that the cleaning of a pressure sensor caused a second service pump in the tower to start up creating the cloudy condition. The problem was corrected and hydrants in the affected area were flushed to clear the water. Brandon is requesting quotes for a complete inspection of the tower, inside and out, and those are expected at the August meeting. The manganese levels are still elevated. The quality of the water remains at a very safe level. Discussions continue with IDEM and EVOQUA to identify and correct this problem.
- c. Upcoming Conferences / Training Classes: October 26th is the Indiana Regional Sewer District Association annual meeting and several members will attend. Brandon will get Jesse signed up for the test prep course this summer. Brad to confirm with Brandon that he is utilizing the NetDMR as required by IDEM. Brad will complete for forms to participate in the salary survey being conducted by the Alliance.

4. Administrator's Report

- a. Status Report: Brad reported that there were 120 ACHs, 16 credit card payments, 1 valve turn, and 1 returned check. There were 4 shut offs with 2 still off at this time.
- b. Write-Offs: None at this time
- c. Correspondence: Letter from Russ Stenger concerning the north gate.
- 5. Attorney's Report: None at this time
- 6. Committee Reports
 - a. Board Member Guide Committee
 - i. Board Training Topic: None for this meeting.

7. Old Business

- a. Rate Study Update: Buzz Krohn of O.W. Krohn & Associates, LLP presented his Special Purpose Report for both the water and sewer utilities. Both are on file in the office. He indicated that the Bond Refunding that was just completed this year has helped to get the required revenue/debt ratios back into compliance. He stated that while a rate increase is not needed immediately to remain in compliance, we are not sufficiently funding our depreciation at the current rates and this needs addressed. He also indicated that we should consider whether we will need any significant capital improvements as some of the infrastructure is aging and may need replaced. He recommended that we consider implementing small gradual rate increases over the next two to three years. It was decided that all members would review the Report and further discussions on this matter would be held at future meetings.
- b. Napoleon Water Update: Our attorney has reviewed the contract agreement between Napoleon Water and Decatur County Water and feels it is pretty straight forward and would be a good guideline for us to follow in an agreement with Napoleon Water for emergency backup water supply here at the Lake. The next step will be a meeting with NRW in order to begin determining some of the details associated with implementing this program.
- c. North Gate License Options: Our attorney, Anne Poindexter, offered several options, with the two most viable listed below. First option could be an open ended license, terminable at will. There would not be a monetary consideration involved with this option. Second could be a long term lease with a payment of some amount. The lease value would be tied to the appraised value of the property in some fashion. The Board felt that option #1 was the best one to suit our requirements. Scott will ask Anne to draw up such a lease so that we may have further discussions at the August meeting.
- d. RWWD Property Sale Options: In the same letter from Anne that is listed in item C above, she outlined the required steps in order to sell District property. The Board felt this was not something we wanted to do at this time and tabled this subject for discussion at another time.
- e. Replacement Board Member: Past Board member Frank Erdosy has expressed interest in being considered to occupy the upcoming open position.
- 8. New Business: None at this time
- 9. Adjourn

Willoughby, Mayor of Greensburg in 1901, secured a gift from the Andrew Carnegie Foundation for \$15,000 for the construction of a library building - with the provision the citizens would provide the land and support the library. The site of the R.H. Watson Foundry, a triangular plot of ground bound by Michigan Avenue, Jackson Street and Central Avenue was selected for the site of the new library at the cost of \$6,000

The Carnegie Library opened
January 25, 1905. The cost of the
building and all its furnishings was
\$11,916. The first Library Board
President was Will Cumback, the
former Lieutenant Governor of
Indiana, and the first librarian was
Miss Bessie Monfort.

In 1990, the Library purchased 2.6 acres from the Odd Fellows. On October 4, 1992, the ground breaking was held, and the current building was dedicated on August 29, 1993.
