#### Lake Santee Regional Waste & Water District December 2015 Newsletter

To all Lake Santee Regional Waste and Water District customers. WELCOME to our first ever Newsletter.

As many of you may have learned by reading the Lake Santee History book that was a part of the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration this summer, the Smoke Signals used to include an article labeled "Big Chief Speaks". This occurred in the very early days of the lake community and was a brief report of current events from the Property Owners Association Board President. We are going to borrow heavily from that idea and begin a periodic Newsletter that focuses on news and events related to the Regional Waste & Water District (RWWD).

We understand that not everyone opens up their newly arrived Smoke Signals and immediately flips to the RWWD Meeting Minutes pages. And, regrettably, we have even heard rumors that some people have never made it to those pages, at all. So, our hope is that this Newsletter idea can provide you with a brief 1-page update on interesting topics, important information, and upcoming events. The format of the Newsletter will evolve with time to become more ascetically pleasing, as this first issue is just a few typed up paragraphs to update you on the granular activated carbon issue and the IDEM notice posted in the November Smoke Signals. We hope this type of brief update will be useful to you in the months and years to come.

#### Carbon issue – to remind us of the history

The granular activated carbon was replaced in May as part of routine maintenance. We bought the carbon from the same supplier (Evoqua/Siemens) as we had previously. The carbon should last about 2 years. After the carbon was replaced, the plant immediately began to see increased turbidity in the finished water that was passed through the carbon tanks. IDEM was called to help troubleshoot, came out to the plant, ran some tests, and it was decided to by-pass the carbon tanks as the carbon seemed to be leaching manganese – we had not experienced this issue on previous carbon changes. The summer was frustrating trying to get Evoqua to help us resolve the carbon issue – they have been very unresponsive. We ultimately had to reach out to a different company, and at the recommendation of Indiana Rural Water, we contacted Water Solutions for help.

#### Carbon issue - update from 11/19/15 monthly RWWD Meeting

Water Solutions oversaw independent tests on the water at various points along the treatment process and oversaw tests on the carbon material. Those water test results were reviewed at the 11/19/15 meeting and confirmed that the carbon is the source of the manganese. As we have been by-passing the carbon tanks since IDEM's help in May, the finished drinking water has not contained increased manganese levels. The carbon test results indicated that the carbon is already breaking down, well ahead of its 2 year life expectancy – it is believed this premature breakdown of the carbon is the primary reason for the leached manganese. The RWWD Board of Trustees voted to immediately replace the carbon with carbon from a new supplier. Water Solutions has recommended a carbon supplier. Also, a representative from Indiana American Water (and a part time Lake Santee resident) has offered to provide alternate carbon supplier names from his work experience. Once the carbon is replaced, new tests will be conducted to ensure the issue has been resolved. The appropriate information related to the costs of the bad carbon material, replacing the carbon, the extensive testing, etc. will be turned over to the RWWD's attorney to follow up with Evoqua.

#### IDEM notice that was posted in the November Smoke Signals – additional information

A notice related to exceeding the HAA maximum containment level as of 6/30/15 was received from IDEM in mid-October and was published in the November Smoke Signals. Since that publication, there were 3 customers who attended the 11/19/15 monthly meeting and 1 customer who sent a letter to the office – all 4 asking for additional information. Several questions were addressed during the meeting. A common theme across these customers was a desire to have information provided in a timelier manner. The idea of this Newsletter, in no small part, is an attempt to provide the community with just those types of updates.

As the notice from November indicated, HAA is formed when organic matter comes into contact with chlorine, which is one of the chemicals we use to treat the water. The granular activated carbon helps remove (adsorb) organic matter from the water. With the carbon issues mentioned above, we have been by-passing the carbon tanks. The carbon is being replaced and the water will no longer by-pass the carbon tanks, which will better aid in controlling the HAA levels. The plant was back in compliance as of August and remains so today.

(With so many yards and garages serving as retail establishments these days, it makes you wonder why so many people bought so many things they didn't need in the first place)

Like mushrooms in spring and sweltering heat in summer, yard and garage sales are becoming as much a part of the seasonal scene as crabgrass and moles. Even before the chill of winter is gone, signs begin appearing in yards and telephone poles, and ads in newspapers announce the beginning of the amateur retail season. Aspiring merchants dig through their closets, drawers, the basement and the garage and offer for sale those unwanted items that were important when they were purchased, but now are no more valuable to their owners than broken bricks. However, it's a well known fact that one man's garbage is another man's fertilizer. So, herds of shoppers rise early on Friday or Saturday to be first in line at the selections of prime fertilizer.

Contrary to popular belief, there are some among us who aren't so enthusiastic as to get up at 5:00 a.m. on a weekend just to come in first in the race to acquire a twenty year old lawn mower with a broken handle for only \$5. As far as I'm concerned, arriving at the scene before 3:00 p.m. is foolish. By that time anything worth more than fifty cents will be gone and I won't have to worry about finding a place in the basement for something else I don't really need but can't resist.

After spending a recent morning roaming a number of neighborhood yard sales I'm convinced of one thing. Dow Chemicals plastic division would make a lot of money by buying back and recycling all the monstrous plastic toys and play things parents buy their kids and then re-sell for pennies on the dollar a year later. Some of those things would require a semi pulling a low boy to haul away. I bought nothing but Judy bought a bag full of—bags. I can understand because you don't find a bag full of bags every day. As we strolled from yard to yard I began to wonder if this phenomenon is new or has it been going on for years. I envisioned a yard sale taking place in colonial times and whether it would be similar to today's craze. If so, it probably would go something like this:

Advertisement in the Charleston Sun Gazette:

"Ye yarde saele to be conducted on ye Battery Boulevard on Saturday fromme 7:00 o'clocke of the a.m. until 5:00 o'clocke of the p.m. Numerous items of interest to be offered, to include ye clothing of quality for a faer lady as well as for children newly bornne and of the age of six." "For the gentleman is offered a slightly used cannon ball of large calibre and a cannon barrel to match ye said calibre. Powder of sufficient strength and quantity to launch ye cannon ball is also offered at a faer price. Also available for ye farmer is a brace of mules to relieve ye wife of the chores of plowing and hauling of stonnes. Numerous other items and various antique pieces too numerous to liste. No early sales and no commerce to be conducted on ye Sabbath".


Readers, especially those in need of a good used artillery piece, would then make plans to arise at dawn and be at the site, hopefully before anyone else. If more than one sale was advertised, they would take the heavy duty wagon and the strongest team of horses to haul their booty home. While the gentleman would haggle with the former general in the Continental Army over the price of the cannon, his wife would browse through the rest of the goods. Her curiosity aroused, she would ask, "What is an antique?" All attempts to explain it would fall on deaf ears since everything in colonial America was old and mostly worn out. She would buy it anyway, thinking

a wooden hay rake along with the moth eaten beaver skin quilt would spruce up a wall in her kitchen.

Arriving home after a morning of "lawn" sales they would unload their bounty which would include a crate of scroungy chickens that hadn't laid an egg in two years and a scruffy hound that had to be helped down off the wagon. With the cannon loaded and placed in the front yard as a deterrent to Indian attack and the hound asleep under the porch, they would count their blessings at acquiring such useful stuff at ridiculously low prices. The wife would breathe a sigh of relief at her sudden liberation as the new brace of mules was led into the barn, and the husband would feel the same relief at knowing that building the stone fence around the garden patch and the plowing would be done more efficiently. So, maybe things haven't changed that much over the years as we follow the same rules that govern yard and garage sales. You bought it thinking you needed it and I'll buy it thinking I can't live without it. As for me, I would pass on the mules, but an artillery piece would really spruce up the front yard.

Abba's love of nature inspired the Nature Trail
Where she could identify species without fail.
I think she planted along SW Santee Drive, too,
A small flower garden which, round a curve, popped into view.

Ah, yes, dear Abba I'll never forget, So intwined with Santee memories yet. Though forced to leave because of her health, Behind she left a much-treasured wealth...

# Warm Caramel Apple Pudding Cake

- 1 large granny smith apple, peeled and thinly sliced
- 1 pkg. yellow cake mix, divided
- 2 pkg. (3.4 oz each) vanilla instant pudding
- 1 1/2 cups cold milk
- 1 jar (12.25 oz) caramel ice cream topping
- 1/4 cup water
- 1 cup thawed whipped topping
- 1/2 cup dry roasted peanuts

### **Directions:**

- 1. Heat oven to 350°F. Toss apples with 1 Tbsp. cake mix. Prepare cake batter with remaining cake mix as directed on package; pour into 13x9-inch baking dish sprayed with cooking spray. Top with apples.
- 2. Beat dry pudding mixes, milk, 3/4 cup caramel topping and water with whisk 2 min.; drizzle over apples. Place baking dish on baking sheet.
- 3. Bake cake 1 hour to 1 hour 10 min. or until golden brown. Cool 20 min. (Sauce will thicken slightly as it cools.)
- 4. Whisk remaining caramel topping and whipped topping until well blended. Spoon over cake slices just before serving; top with nuts.


# Christmas for the Birds

# Lake Santee Regional Waste & Water District <u>Meeting Minutes</u> Meeting of October 15, 2015

#### eeting of Octobe 3:30 PM

Lake Santee Community Room

#### 1. Roll Call

Scott Gibbs called the meeting to order and requested a roll call. Members present were Scott Gibbs, Clair Fredrickson, Kathy Tarzwell, and Jim Hornig. Absent were Greg Montgomery, Ed Fox, and Paul Gosnell. Also attending were Brandon Litmer, Utility Superintendent and Brad Jones, Utility Administrator.

#### 2. Consent Items

- a. Minutes from September 17, 2015
- b. Financial Reports
- c. Register of Claims for sewer operating
- d. Register of Claims for water operating

A motion was made by Clair Fredrickson and seconded by Kathy Tarzwell to accept the consent items as presented. Motion carried.

### 3. Operator's Report

a. Sewer Status Report

Brandon reported that the sewer plant is operating well with no issues and all tests are normal.

#### b. Water Status Report

Brandon reported that all tests are normal. The quality of the water continues to be at a very safe level, but the issue with the elevated manganese levels continues when water is passed through the carbon tanks; so the carbon tanks are still being bypassed.

During the week of 10/5/15, we received a letter from IDEM stating that we needed to issue a public notice to all customers related to exceeding a drinking water standard back in May. Back in May, the disinfectant by-product level for HAA exceeded the MCL for that test. This occurred while water was by-passing the carbon tanks. Carbon removes organic matter from the water. When organic matter comes in contact with chlorine, haloacetic acids (HAA) are formed. We will immediately post the notice on the website and also include IDEM's letter in the Smoke Signals. We are already back in compliance with this test. The test occurred in May and IDEM just sent their letter in October, so this is not any type of emergency, but does require all customers be notified.

#### i. EVOQUA

The company that supplied the carbon is EVOQUA and they have been completely uncooperative in helping to determine a resolution to the elevated manganese levels since our last carbon change. After promising to test their carbon and send us the test results, Evoqua has refused to supply the test results to us and are not returning Brandon's phone calls. Joe, the EVOQUA sales manager, finally called Brandon back on 10/15/15, only after his collections department told him we still have not paid them for the carbon. Joe has contacted their carbon expert to get involved, whatever that means. Joe told Brandon that since the manganese is soluble, we should be able to flush out the manganese, so

#### R.W.W.D. minutes continued

Brandon is trying that again; although, we have already flushed tens of thousands of gallons through the carbon trying this approach. Brandon reiterated how unhappy we are with their service and their lack of responsiveness to this issue. Joe is to get back with us; Brandon to call Joe if we haven't heard anything by this coming Wednesday.

At the suggestion of Rural Water, Brandon contacted Water Solutions last month to assist us with this issue. Water solutions can provide new carbon at \$1.60/lb, same as EVOQUA's price. Brandon and Water Solutions are to sample the water after the carbon and send to Eaton for testing to confirm that the carbon is the issue with the elevated manganese. We will continue to withhold payment to EVOQUA until the problem is resolved, as the IDEM test results indicate that the carbon supplied by EVOQUA is the source of the manganese.

- ii. Water tower inspection / cleaning
  Brandon reported that Dixon Engineering will do the inspection and cleaning on 11/23/15. The tower will have to be drained to perform this work. The pumps will provide pressure to the system while the tower is being inspected and cleaned. After Dixon is complete, Brandon will run some tests prior to putting the tower back in service. Dixon did not indicate how long it would take to receive the official report.
- c. Upcoming Conferences / Training Classes The IRSDA annual conference is set for 10/26, and most of the board will attend. Jesse's water distribution test is 11/5 – he has been attending the weekly test prep classes. IDEM will perform an on-site test with a written and a hands-on test for the water treatment portion of the test. There is a free Board Training class in Connersville on 11/18 for those who are interested.

#### 4. Administrator's Report

a. Status Report

Brad reported there were 129 ACHs, 14 credit card payments, 0 valve turns, and 10 shut offs (with all back on) this past month. The POA is looking into a new phone package with ETC, which may save the District some money.

#### **Attention Absentee Home Owners**

Homeowners would be well advised to turn off their water while away. Homeowners are prohibited from operating the water meter valve or removing and/or loosening the meter to drain lines. All customers are required by the rules to have their own valves in place to valve off and drain their homes as necessary. If you want the District to also turn off the meter valve, we will be happy to do so, however the District will not be held liable for meter valves that are not 100% tight. You are advised not to depend solely on the meter valve. The charge for valving is \$10.00 during regular work hours of 7:30 AM to 4:00 PM, \$20.00 after hours. The same charges apply to valves turned on. The District cannot turn on water to a home unless the customer has a valve closed to protect the home or a responsible adult is present.

# **Homeowners Pumps**

Your grinder pump is not a garbage disposal. The following items should not be put in your system: Glass metal, diapers, socks, rags, cloth, plastics, sanitary napkins, tampons, explosives, flammable materials, lubricating oils or grease, strong chemicals, gasoline, sand, gravel, fish scales, cleaning fluids, pesticides, herbicides and toxic chemicals. The District owns the grinder station and customers are not permitted to open the tank or control panel.



If the red light on the electric box for your grinder pump is on, it means your pump is not working properly. During regular business hours call the office at 527-2943. After regular hours call 560-1157 if you see your light or your neighbors' light on.

A district employee will respond promptly. Also remember, there is an ordinance that prohibits the planting of trees, flowers, shrubs or other plantings within five feet of the station to allow accessibility. In addition no plantings shall be placed on the side of the pump facing the nearest road to promote visibility of the visual alarm from the roadway. Painting of the control panel or pump tank is prohibited.

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


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
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
