Erosion Control Protecting your shoreline is your job!

Every water front owner knows their lake frontage is one of their greatest assets. Like any other asset, it must be protected. This article is to help property owners understand the issues and how to protect your shoreline properly.

As a lake front owner, it is our responsibility to pick the best type of shoreline protection for each individual lot. Yep, that's right, shoreline control is not a "one size fits all" kind of thing. The best type will depend on your shoreline, the type of activity it encounters, the slope, and of course, your visual preference. Options range from natural vegetation, rip rap, and concrete walls to name a few

When it comes to picking a shoreline protection, it's important to think about why you need it and what you want to do.

> If you live down a cove or in the and more gradual slope is likely the answer for you. The best options in these areas that experience less waves are called "soft controls". Soft controls use natural plant growth and gradual slopes to protect the

For those members who live on the main lake, and experience a lot of waves, you may need to opt for the "hard controls". These include textured retaining walls and riprap. However, it is important to note that retaining walls can cause more harm than they are worth. On the next page we will discuss erosion in more detail and give some ideas on how to control your shoreline.

Understanding Erosion>>>

The dirty truth about erosion and its impact on the lake

Erosion is the silent enemy

of waterfront owners. It sneaks upon us and break our shores and our banks. (Yes, pun intended)

What is it?

Erosion is a gradual disintegrate of our shorelines and surfaces. It comes from water flowing or rushing over the surface and from the ripples breaking on the soil surface. When the water moves in and out, it pulls soil and sediment with it.



Why it matters

When the sediment breaks from the shore, it moves beneath the surface of the water and is deposited on the lake bottom or carried through the water. Over time, erosion will cause the depths

around the lake to change and the water to become murky.

Erosion also eats away at your shoreline costing you precious space for fishing and relaxing.



What can you do?

Prevention is key to stopping erosion. Once it has already entered the lake, it is costly and involves dredging to correct. This is why it is up to the property owner to pick a control and prevent the sediment from entering the lake.

Picking a control >>> Riprap Vs. Seawall

All it takes is one pontoon ride around the lake to realize the options for shoreline protection are abundant to say the least. But, the most popular are rip rap and concrete, so how do you decide?

Rip Rap is made of large broken stone that are layered and line the shoreline at a more gradual slope. These stones fit together helping to hold them in place. When the waves break against this shoreline, it will absorb the impact allowing the energy from the wave to dissipate.

In the case of storms, the water will drain over the riprap and through the rocks. This will cause a buildup of leaves and sticks in the rocks that can be a bit of a pain to clean out. But, its better it's caught in the rocks than at the bottom of the lake.

When placing rip rap, it is important to layer it. You want to place smaller (six inch) stones first. This helps to establish a good base. Next you will add the large stones (12 inch). Make sure you place these in an appropriate slope to your lot allowing for slowed drainage and proper wave breakage.







Retaining walls are a hard control for erosion. They are used on banks and shorelines that are steep. Retaining walls are typically made at a 90 degree angle and of a solid material. Because of their hard surface and abrupt angle, they cause the waves to crash into their surface without absorbing the energy. That wave then continues to push down the shore subsequently causing damage on neighboring shorelines and properties.

If a retaining wall is necessary, it is important to use a surface that will encourage the waves to break and to create as much angle as possible. Using a textured material can help reduce the transfer of energy, helping to create a smaller ripple moving opposite the wall.

There is no easy answer to shoreline protection, we all do the best with that we have. If you have questions, please don't hesitate to contact the office and we will help you find a good resource.

CREAM OF POTATO SOUP

PREP: 30 MINS | TOTAL TIME: 45 MINS SERVINGS: 8 BOWLS

- 8 medium potatoes peeled and quartered
- 3 stalks of celery chopped
- 1 medium onion chopped
- 1 stick of butter
- 1 1/2 teaspoons salt
- 1 1/2 teaspoons sugar
- **STEP 1** In medium stock pot combine all the above ingredients and barely cover with water. Bring to a boil then simmer until potatoes are tender and water has reduced by half. Remove from stove and using a potato masher, mash until desired consistency. A few lumps are fine.

 - i. Brittany stated the office is still collecting resumes and will start interviewing candidates in a week or two.



Signs of Fall - Changing from Whew to Brrr

September, October, November

Even though time on the clock doesn't "fall back" until November 4th, Labor Day weekend is the holiday that signals the end of summer. School has begun, boats are being taken out of the water and the horizon opens up as the crops are harvested. Mother Nature has her ways of letting us know that winter is on its way in changes in the weather and plant and animal life. The study of seasonal changes to our habitat is called phenology and we all do it when we decide to wear sunglasses, take a jacket, go fishing or rake leaves.

Here are a few seasonal changes to look for with space for the date of your observation:

- 1) Birds flock together to prepare to migrate southward: notice turkey vultures, swallows and redwing blackbirds.
- 2) The hummingbird feeders will have fewer visitors and finally remain abandoned.
- 3) Those bright yellow male American Gold Finches will take on a dull greenish color for the winter.
- 4) The warblers are coming! Thousands will migrate south to spend the winter. They are small birds, mostly a color combination of black, white, yellow and gray and hang around up in the trees. The Yellow-rumped Warbler or Myrtle is common to Lake Santee. See if you can spot one.
- 5) Snow birds! Or juncos as they are also known, along with tree sparrows arrive to take the place of chipping sparrows.
- 6) Deer change color, too. Their light coat darkens as the days shorten and the temperature drops.
- 7) Notice a drop in humidity and crispness in the air? Ah, it's fall!
- 8) The most noticeable change is, of course the leaves of the trees as they turn colors from yellow to orange to gold to red to brown. Peak season is usually weeks 2 and 3 in October. As in the spring, this is a particularly beautiful time at Lake Santee because we have so many trees.

9) First frost on the windshield.

10) First snow! Time to get out the snow shovel.

- A member asked about who was responsible for the ditches alongside the road not draining. Brittany took down the lot number and would have Brandon look at the ditch.
- A member spoke in detail in regards to shoreline protection along with the use of ballast systems on boats. He asked for the board to complete the proper research prior to making any adjustments to current rules.
- A member thanked the maintenance crew for applying the lignin on the gravel roads.

CORRESPONDENCE

Brittany Green stated she did not have any correspondence to report.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Rules & Regulations – Angel Hocker

Angel presented the first reading of rule 17 for the addition of the new shelter house located at the main beach.

Shelter House

17.1 WHO MAY USE:

a) The Association Board may reserve the Shelter for events as needed.

b) Lake Santee clubs and organizations may reserve the Shelter for Board approved events.

c) Members in good standing may reserve the Shelter for approved activities.d) The Shelter is not available to the general public, unless approved by the Board of Directors.

17.2 ACTIVITIES PERMITTED

a) All activities shall be conducted in compliance with all applicable federal, state and local laws, as well as within the Rules and Regulations of the Association.

b) Any activity judged by the Board to be destructive to the facilities or to be improper shall not be permitted.

c) The Board of Directors reserves the right to refuse any individual, club, or organization the right to use the Shelter.

d) Any activity at which food, drink, or other items are offered for sale, or at which admission or cover charges are contemplated must have prior approval of the Board.

17.3 FACILITIES AVAILABLE

a) The Shelter is rectangular 28' wide x 60' long in size, or 1,680 square feet.

b) Handicap accessible restrooms are available within the Beach restroom.

17.4 HOURS

a) Sunday through Thursday: all activities shall cease prior to 10:00 p.m. (cleanup may continue quietly).

b) Friday and Saturday: All activities shall cease prior to 12:00 midnight (cleanup may continue quietly).

c) The hours may be extended by the Board of Directors for special functions.

17.5 FEES & DEPOSITS

a) All functions of the Association, their designated committees, and Lake Santee clubs and organizations may be permitted without charge, unless special permit fees are required.

b) Functions limited to three hours or less shall be charged \$45.00 rental and \$45.00 damage deposit, plus any applicable permit or legally required fees.

c) Daytime functions of more than three hours duration and concluding prior to 6:00 p.m. shall be charged \$115.00 rental and \$115.00 damage deposit, plus any applicable permit or legally required fees.

d) Functions beginning after 6:00 p.m. of more than three hours duration shall be charged \$125.00 rental and \$125.00 damage deposit, plus any applicable permit or legally required fees.

e) Functions running through the afternoon and continuing past 6:00 p.m. shall be charged \$175.00 rental and \$175.00 damage deposit plus any applicable permit or legally required fees.

f) All monies shall be collected by personnel in the Lake Santee Office.

g) Damage deposit will be refunded within 48 hours of function, but not until the facilities have been thoroughly inspected. Deposit will have to be picked up at the Lake Santee Office or received by mail as requested.

h) If inspection reveals incomplete cleanup including outside trash containers, and time allows, renter will be contacted for immediate follow up action.

Otherwise, cleanup will be completed by lake personnel who will be paid with all or part of the damage deposit as necessary.

i) If inspection reveals damage exceeding normal wear and tear, renter will be contacted to discuss and view damage. All or part of the damage deposit will be

applied to replace items or repair items damaged as deemed necessary by the Lake Office personnel or the Board.

17.6 SCHEDULING

a) All scheduling shall be done by personnel in the Lake Santee Office during regular office hours.

b) A calendar of events and reservations will be available in the office.

c) The Association Board, and Lake Santee clubs, and organizations may schedule the Shelter up to one year in advance.

d) Members may reserve the Shelter up to six months in advance.

e) A contract must be completed and signed at the time a reservation is made requiring a rental fee. A copy of the contract and rules will be provided to the renter.

f) The rental fee is due at the time of contract signing and the damage deposit is due 48 hours prior to the approved event.

g) Full refunds of advance rental will be given for cancellations made fourteen (14) days or more prior to the date reserved. Within the fourteen days of the reserved date, refunds will be given only when cancellation is due to uncontrollable circumstances. The decision to refund is to be made by the Lake Santee personnel or the Board.

17.7 DECORATING

- a) No nails, staples, tacks, or tape are to be used on walls ceilings, or trim.b) No open flames will be used in or around the Shelter
- c) If scheduling permits, decorating may be done in advance of reservation time.

17.8 CLEANUP

a) The Shelter and surrounding area shall be thoroughly cleaned. The cleanliness of each should meet or surpass the conditions prior to use.

b) The area surrounding the Shelter must be policed for litter resulting from the function.

c) All trash must be removed prior to leaving the area of the Shelter, and disposed of by persons in charge.

d) Final cleanup may be completed by the following morning if prior approval is received, no other events are scheduled and cleanup is completed by 10:00 am.e) Trash bags and cleaning supplies are the responsibility of the renter.

f) Follow the prepared checklist when cleaning.

17.9 EQUIPMENT USAGE

a) Tables, chairs, and other equipment shall not be removed from the community room for use in connection with the Shelter.

17.10 GENERAL PROVISIONS

a) Shelter hours require the presence of a responsible adult supervisor.

b) The member scheduling the rental function must attend that function.

e) No minors will be permitted without adult supervision.

f) If the user/renter needs equipment at the Shelter for an event that requires delivery by vehicle to the site, such vehicles may be driven to the site for unloading and loading if the condition of the site is favorable. All vehicles must be returned to the parking lot or a designated area after unloading or loading. Unloading or loading at the site should be kept as short as possible, however, in no case be longer than two (2) hours. Site conditions will be determined prior to any event by the Lake office.

g) Any member misusing the Shelter or allowing misuse of the Shelter shall be denied future use of the facilities for a period to be determined by the Board.

17.11 ENFORCEMENT OF THE SHELTER RULES & REGULATIONS

a) Enforcement is the primary responsibility of the sponsoring organization or member.

b) Enforcement may be by any Board Member, Lake Santee employee, Lake Santee Security, or member of the office staff

c) Where punitive action is deemed necessary by any of the above or the Association Board of Directors, enforcement shall be as provided for in the Association By-laws, under RULES, REGULATIONS AND LEGAL COMMITTEE.

A motion was made by Angel Hocker to accept the rule as read, Polly Ann Fox provided the second. Motion carried. The second reading of the rule will take place at the September board meeting.

In Carol's absence Angel gave a brief report for Carol and stated to please check the Smoke Signals for the most up to date information in regards to the recreation calendar. A member in the audience did mention the Women's Club Annual Auction would be held that Saturday starting at 6PM.

In Dave's absence Brittany Green gave a brief report stating that they are still waiting on the quotes for the dam inspection. They are also hoping to get a time scheduled for the plantings that will be happening as part of the Silt and Sedimentation committee.
